Under MIDH, Government of India (GOI) contributes 60%, of total outlay for developmental programmes, 40% share is contributed by State Governments. The main objective behind this scheme is to enhance horticulture production, augment farmers' income and strengthen nutritional security.

Mushroom Cultivation: Training programme on “Mushroom Cultivation” was organized by Institute of Horticulture Technology in February. The major components of the course were interactive lectures on structure for mushroom cultivation and cultivation practices for button mushroom and hands on training on preparation of compost for mushroom cultivation, spawn production, methods of seed/spawn sowing in grow bags, casing and methods of casing preparation, methods of irrigation for mushroom cultivation and application of fungicide /insecticide.

Latest News- 2020-21 Budget Highlights

More than Rs 2.83 lakh crore would be spent on Agriculture, Rural Development, Irrigation and allied activities as farmers and rural poor continue to remain the key focus of the Government. Reiterating the commitment of doubling farmers' income by 2022, Government has already provided resilience for 6.11 crore farmers insured under PM Fasal Bima Yojana. Agriculture credit target for the 2020-21 has been set at Rs 15 lakh crore. All eligible beneficiaries of PM-KISAN will be covered under the KCC scheme. Moreover, comprehensive measures for one hundred water stressed districts, proposal to expand PM-KUSUM to provide 20 lakh farmers for setting up stand-alone solar pumps and for another 15 lakh farmers to solarise their grid-connected pump sets, setting up of efficient warehouses at the block level and in Horticulture sector with focus on "one product one district" for better marketing and export are some of the steps in that direction.



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
